What is Baptism?

The word baptiso in the Greek means to immerse and was used to describe clothing that was dipped into a die to change its appearance. It is not actually a word, it is what is called a transliteration. That is a word that is not translated it is just left as it is from its original language. (This is done because at the time of the translation an accurate translation would have caused too much controversy so it was never translated) It should say immersed. Not baptized.

When you think of Baptism what images come to mind?

The practice of Baptism was a very public event in the early church that was originally done at the local river or water reserve and everyone in your town or village saw you and new what you were doing. Baptism told everyone that you were a follower of Christ and could and in many times did cause many Christians to loose there life for there faith.

- How does this affect our status in Life?

Ephesians 4:1-7

- How are we to treat one another? Why
- It what ways are we connected as believers?

Finally let's look at Galatians 3: 26-28

- What does God mean when he says we are no longer Jews nor Gentiles, men or women?
- What does it mean to you personally to know that when you accept Jesus Christ as your Lord and savior you are made one with him and all other believers.
